Association of Connecticut Fairs ANNUAL SCHOLARSHIP

Each year the Association of Connecticut Fairs awards two scholarships in the amount of \$1000.00 each to a graduating high school senior or current college student to assist them with continuing their education at an accredited institution of higher learning.

These scholarships are awarded as follows:

- One \$1000.00 scholarship to agraduating senior or current college student who will be pursuing a course of study in agriculture, home economics or a related field during the next school year.
- One \$1000.00 scholarship to a graduating senior or current college student who will be pursuing a course of in any field during the next school year.

Eligibility Requirements:

- Applicant must be a high school senior or graduate and must be or have been an active participant or exhibitor at a member of The Association of Connecticut Fairs.
- 2. Each applicant must be sponsored by a member fair.
- 3. Applicants may be required to be interviewed at the discretion of the Scholarship Committee.
- 4. Application must return the completed application form to the sponsoring fair by April 15, 2010.
- 5. The sponsoring fair secretary is required to forward all screened and signed application to the scholarship committee chairman by April 30, 2010.
- All application questions must be completed in order to be considered for an award. A high school or college transcript must be included with the application.
- 7. Scholarship winners will be notified prior to July 1, 2010. Scholarships will be awarded at the annual Fall Meeting & Banquet of The Association of Connecticut Fairs.
- 8. The Association of Connecticut Fairs reserves the right to reject or limit the number of application and not to award any scholarships.

Applications are judged as follows:

Fair Participation	30%
Scholastic Standing	25%
Financial Need	25%
Citizenship & Leadership	20%

Fairs should promote the scholarship program at fair meetings, other local events, in local newspapers and by contacting their local high school guidance department. Each fair should screen each application to be sure all of the conditions listed above are met. Fairs should submit all qualified applications for consideration to the Scholarship Committee.

WHO MAY ENTER: This contest is open to all residents of Connecticut; men, women ad juniors. If entered by juniors, they will be judged with all adult entries.

HOW TO ENTER: Any entry that is entered at any fair that is a member of the Association of Connecticut Fairs is automatically competing in the local contest. Contestants may enter a contest at as many member fairs contests until they win first prize. They will then represent that fair in the state contest. The state contest is held at the annual Association of Connecticut Fairs spring meeting.

JUDGING: The Association of Connecticut Fairs will furnish judges score sheets to each fair. The contestants will receive these sheets at the end of the contest. Judging will be based on overall appearance, workmanship and originality. Decisions of the judges are final.

LOCAL CONTEST: The winner of the quilt contest will receive a blue ribbon from The Association of Connecticut Fairs and will become eligible to submit their entry to the state contest. In the event a fair only receives only one entry in the contest and that entry is worthy of first prize, the association rosette must be awarded to that entry.

STATE CONTEST: The state contest will be held at The Association of Connecticut Fairs spring meeting (check www.ctfairs.org for date and location). Each fair must contact the winner of their local contest and provide information about reservations and other contest info. The Association of Connecticut Fairs does not contact the contestants.

Additions, deletions or substitutions in the recipe is not permitted and will result in disqualification. All decisions of the judges are final.

In the event that only one entry is received at the local contest and that entry is worthy of first prize, that entry must be awarded the first place ribbon.

WHO MAY ENTER: The contest held at each fair is open to all Connecticut residents regardless of age. Commercial, Industrial and Professional Bakers are not eligible.

HOW TO ENTER: Any Connecticut resident entering the Apple Pie Contest and member fair is automatically entered in the local contest. CARDAMOM & CHERRY BRAIDED BREAD

1/4 cup Dried Cherries 2 tablespoons Water 1 pkg. Active Dry Yeast (1 tablespoon) 2 3/4 cups All-Purpose Flour, divided 3/4 tsp. Ground Cardamom 3/4 cup Milk 4 tablespoons Butter 1/3 cup Sugar 1/2 tsp. Salt 1 Egg, Slightly Beaten Milk Dusting Sugar Crystals

Cut dried cherries in half, similar to the size of a raisin, and place in a bowl with water and set aside.

In a large mixing bowl, combine yeast, 3/4 cup of flour and cardamom.

Heat together milk, butter, sugar and salt just until warm, stirring occasionally to melt butter. Cool to approximately 110 degrees. Add to dry mixture in mixing bowl; add egg. Beat at low speed with electric mixer for 30 seconds, scraping sides of bowl constantly. Beat at high speed for 3 minutes.

By hand, stir enough of the remaining flour to the above mixture to make a soft dough. Turn out onto lightly floured surface; knead till smooth and elastic, 5 to 8 minutes. Gently knead in strained cherries until incorporated throughout the dough, 1 to 2 minutes. Place in lightly greased bowl, cover and keep covered with moist cloth until doubled in bulk. Approximately 1 1/4 hours.

Punch down and turn out onto lightly floured surface. Divide dough into thirds and form into balls. Let rest 10 minutes. Roll each ball into 16" long ropes.

Line up the three ropes on parchment paper lined cookie sheet and braid loosely. Pinch ends and tuck under. Cover, let rise 30 minutes until almost doubled in size.

Brush lightly with milk. Do not soak or allow milk to get on parchment paper. Sprinkle with dusting sugar crystals. Bake at 375 degrees for 20-25 minutes until golden brown.

CINNAMON - CRUMB BLUEBERRY COFFEE CAKE



2 1/2 Cups all purpose flour 1 teaspoon baking powder 1/4 teaspoon baking soda 1/4 teaspoon salt 1 1/4 cups sugar 3/4 cup buttermilk 1/2 cup applesauce 1 large egg 1 teaspoon vanilla 2 teaspoons ground cinnamon 2/3 cup brown sugar 2 tablespoons butter, melted 1 1/4 cup fresh blueberries 1 tablespoon confectioners' sugar fresh fruit & mint (optional)

PREHEAT oven to 350 degrees. Coat an 8 inch spring form pan with cooking spray.

In a bowl, mix 2 cups flour, baking powder, baking soda and salt. In a separate large bowl, combine next 5 ingredients. Stir in flour mixture; pour into pan. Mix remaining flour and cinnamon; stir in brown sugar and butter until crumbs form. Sprinkle 1/2 the crumb mixture over batter; sprinkle 1/2 cup blueberries on top. Repeat with remaining crumbs and 1/4 cup blueberries.

BAKE

Bake for 1 hour or until toothpick inserted into center comes out clean. Cool in pan for 45 minutes; remove from pan to rack. Top with remaining 1/4 cup blueberries and sprinkle with confectioners' sugar. Garnish with fresh fruit and mint.

Enter 1 whole coffee cake.


